PJ Grant will host this event for our show. She is asking that members who have vintage quilts let her know. She would like a short history of the quilt or some interesting facts about the quilt (if you don't know the history). Facts can be about the pattern, estimated time it was created, fabrics used, how you obtained it, etc.

October 4, 2018

General Meeting Minutes

First Vice-President Penni Simily called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and led the flag salute. She expressed appreciation for the evening's substitute greeter Peggy McKnelly, and recognized Sharon Weaver for the refreshment table set up. Penni thanked the October birthday ladies for the refreshments and reminded the June and July birthday ladies to bring cookies to the December meeting.

Nancy Swanson made a motion to accept the September General Meeting Minutes as published in the newsletter and Sharon Weaver seconded the motion. Minutes for September were approved by the membership. There were no questions or corrections to the Treasurer's report as printed in the September newsletter. The Treasurer's report was therefore filed for audit as submitted.

Helen Brown reported for Membership, noting that 49 members were present, and Door Prize drawing was held. Helen also announced that the 2019 application for membership along with annual dues will be due by January 1. The application will be published in the newsletter in November. Membership payment checks will be held until after January 1.

Betsy Anne Youngholm thanked the members for participating in a "Fabric Frenzy Among Friends" prior to the general meeting. She announced that Cuddle Quilt Sewing will be held as usual at Bear Paw on Tuesday, October 16th.

Penni and Betsy Anne introduced the request for quilts and donations from the Redding, California, Quilters Sew-ciety. Almost 1100 homes were destroyed by the Carr Fire and the Redding quilters are distributing quilts to some of those who were affected by the fire. Betsy Anne asked that anyone wishing to donate, please contact her and she will organize delivery.

Betsy Anne recognized Teri de la Torre as the new coordinator of the 2019 fall retreat, dates to be announced.

First Vice President Penni Simily announced the upcoming programs, with tonight's free motion quilting demonstrations by SMQA members, a November presentation by Claire Witherspoon with a "Scrap Strategies" workshop the next day, and the Holiday Party in December. Sign up for the November workshop is available. Tickets for the dinner on December 6th are available tonight and at the November General Meeting for \$15. Please pay by check or exact cash.

For Second Vice President Sandy Johnson, Lissa Metzger introduced the next row of blocks for the Row Quilt pattern and reminded members that the patterns and directions are on the SMQA website.

Sally Walker indicated that she would be willing to help anyone having difficulty with the Mystery Quilt borders. She would be available at the Bear Paw Cuddle Quilt sewing on October 16th if people will let her know they need assistance.

The Nominating Committee (Betsy Blum, Sharon Weaver, and Lynn Gray) presented the slate for 2019 officers. Voting will be at the November General Meeting. President: Patty Spinelli, First Vice President: Laura Fisher and Betsy Anne Youngholm, Second Vice President: Joanie Madaus and Deb Austin, Treasurer: Kay Marshall. Betsy noted that the Board is still looking for an individual or group to coordinate the cuddle quilt program in 2019.

Linda Pennington presented a book of photographs and a card to Donna Baxter in recognition of all her hard work and support of SMQA over the years. She thanked Lissa Metzger for putting the book together and Helen Brown for creating the card.

For the 2019 Quilt Show Committee, Sinta Borland and Betsy Blum discussed the current situation for white gloves at the PIQF in October as well as volunteers to sit with the quilt and sell raffle tickets. PJ Grant asked for antique or vintage quilts to be shown at the bed turning at the Quilt Show. She requested that she also be given a history or story for the quilts.

The business portion of the meeting was adjourned at 6:35 p.m. and was followed by show-and-tell, refreshments, and the evening's presentation in which Sue Johnson, Lissa Metzger, Colette Wear, and Laura Fisher demonstrated a variety of free motion quilting techniques

The next SMQA General Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, November 1st at 6:00 p.m. Doors open at 5:30 p.m.

SMQA's First Quilt Show . . . A Bit of History

"During the summer of 1981, Judy Crawford, Marge Hoyt, and Betsy Blum expressed a desire to start a Quilt Association in Oakhurst. With this desire, an organizational meeting was held Oct. 18, 1981 in the Oakhurst Fabric House classroom. Nineteen women attended this first organizational meeting, elected officers & set the meeting nights as the 1st and 3rd Thursday of the month at the Sierra Telephone Bldg. At the time that the quilt association was begun, publicity stated that *the only requirement for membership is a "love of quilting."* (From the program of the first SMQA Quilt Show Program.)

Myra Algots created the first logo (see below).

A small quilt show was held in the Oakhurst library in 1982. And the first Opportunity Quilt was created which earned \$402. In 1983, the first official quilt show was held, named "For the Love of Quilting."


